This is your booklet to work through this week and to keep after camp. You will receive your awards in this book at the end of the week, so hang on to it. The most important thing you will find in the book is your daily Bible Studies. You may work through these studies during your personal devotion time, or any time during the day. Your personal devotion time is a time for you to spend learning about and focusing on God.

The studies in the booklet all focus on the life of Jesus Christ. There are four books in the Bible that talk about Jesus' life. They are Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John. You will be reading primarily from these four books. Throughout this week, focus on what Jesus said and did in order to see if you can build a better picture of who He is.

Bible Award

You will earn your Bible award if you do all of your daily reading and say all of the regular memory verses. You will earn your Bible Scholar award if you say all of your bonus verses and do the Bible Scholar Studies as well.

Monday: The Identity of Jesus Christ

Games

The story you will read today is about when Jesus came to be baptized by John the Baptist. You should know that John the Baptist did not write the book of John, but rather a disciple of Jesus also named John wrote this book.

Read: John 1:19-34

What did the priest and Levites ask John?

Who did John the Baptist say he was? (*Hint: Verse 23*)

What did John say when Jesus came to him?

Who did John say Jesus was? (*Hint: Verse 34*)

Read: Luke 3:21-22

Whose voice do you think it was that came out of heaven?

Who did this voice say Jesus was?

Memory Verse: John 14:6

“Jesus saith unto him, I am the way, the truth, and the life: no man cometh unto the Father, but by me.”

Bonus Memory Verse: Hebrews 1:2

(*God*) “Hath in these last days spoken unto us by his Son, whom he hath appointed heir of all things, by whom also he made the worlds”

Activity Award

Monday: The Identity of Jesus Christ

Bible Scholar Study

Read what John the Baptist said in *John 1:30* again.

Who does John say existed first?

John the Baptist was born before Jesus, why did he say that Jesus existed before him?

This next story is called the transfiguration. The identity of Jesus Christ is confirmed here as well.

Read Matthew 17:1-13

It says in verse three that Moses and Elijah appeared, why is this a miracle?

Whose voice do you think comes out of the bright cloud?

Who does this voice say that Jesus is?

When does Jesus say that Peter, James, and John can tell others about this vision?

Tuesday: Jesus Succeeds Where Man Failed

The Bible teaches that everyone is a sinner. (Romans 3:23). Furthermore, that sin makes us worthy of God's wrath (Romans 6:23). Jesus is different from me and you because he was the only person to ever live who was totally without sin. This means that He was the one person who did not deserve death.

These are a few passages from the Old Testament, they contain some commands that God gave the Israelites.

Read: Deut 8:2-3

This verse is God talking to the Israelites. What does this verse say that man lives by?

Read: Deut 6:13-16

Who does verse 13 say we should worship and fear?

Are we suppose to test God?

Now that you have read those verses read this story about Jesus

Read: Luke 4:1-13

Who tempted Jesus?

When Jesus responded to the temptations, what was He doing?
(Hint: what you read before)

Did Jesus give in to any temptation to go against God's Word?

Memory verse: Hebrews 4:15

"For we have not an high priest which cannot be touched with the feeling of our infirmities; but was in all points tempted like as we are, yet without sin."

Bonus Memory Verse: Isaiah 53:6

Read: Genesis 2:7-9, 16-17

What did God tell the man that he shall not do?

What was the penalty for breaking God’s command?

Read: Genesis 3:1-24

What did the serpent try to get the woman to think about God’s command?

After they had eaten the fruit, what did the man and woman do when God came into the Garden?

What did sin do to God and man’s relationship?

What differences do you see between Adam and Eve, and Jesus?

Wednesday: The Good News

You have read about how Jesus was the Son of God, and you have read about how Jesus was perfectly without sin. Today you will read about when Christ explained salvation to Nicodemus.

Read: John 3:1-21

What had convinced Nicodemus that God was with Jesus?

What did Jesus say Nicodemus needed to see the Kingdom of God?

Did Nicodemus understand what Jesus was trying to explain to him?

In verse 13, Jesus says that the “Son of Man” descended from heaven. Who is he talking about?

When it says in verse 14 that the “Son of Man” will be lifted up, what is that referring to?

What does Jesus say a person needs to do to have everlasting life?

Memory Verse: John 3:14-15

“And as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness even so must the Son of Man be lifted up: that whosoever believeth in him should not perish but have everlasting life”

Bonus Memory Verse: John 3:16-18

Friday: The Work of Christ

Bible Scholar Study

Read: John 20:1-31

What did Mary first think when she saw the empty tomb?

Did Mary recognize Jesus at first?

When did Mary realize that Jesus was speaking to her?

Which disciple was missing when Jesus appeared to them?

What did Jesus say to Thomas after he believed? (*Hint: verse 29*)

Why did John write the book of John?

Through whose name can we have life?

Friday: The Work of Christ

Jesus said and did so many miraculous things while on earth. However, the greatest thing He did for us was to die for our sins and raise back to life three days latter. Today you will read how this all happened.

Read: John 19:1-42

What did Pilate say to the priest and officers in verse 6?

Who really had the authority in this situation? (*Hint: verse 11*)

What did Pilate write and put on the cross?

What do think Jesus meant when He said, "It is finished"?

Why did the soldiers not break Jesus' legs?

What is the significance of Jesus' legs not being broken?

What two men helped bury Jesus?

Memory Verse: I Corinthians 15:3b-4

"Christ died for our sins according to the scriptures; And that he was buried, and that he rose again the third day according to the scriptures."

Bonus Memory Verse: John 20:30-31

Wednesday: The Good News

Bible Scholar Study

Jesus mentioned that "as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, even so must the Son of Man be lifted up."

Here you can read the story that Jesus is talking about

Read: Numbers 21:4-9

Why did the Israelites speak against God?

Instead of complaining, what should the Israelites have done?

What did God do because of their complaints?

The people realized what they had done and asked Moses to pray for them. What did God tell Moses to do?

What did the people need to do in order to live if they were bitten by a serpent?

Thursday: The Authority of Jesus Christ

Today's two stories are among my favorites in the Bible. They show how Jesus can do anything. The first story is about a Roman Centurion. A Centurion was an officer in charge of about 100 soldiers in the Roman military.

Read: Luke 7:1-10

What did the Centurion want Jesus to do?

Did the Centurion believe that Jesus needed to come and see his sick servant in order to heal him?

The Centurion understood that Jesus had authority over everything. Do you trust that Jesus is in control of your life?

Read: Luke 7:11-17

What did Jesus tell the "young man" to do?

What did the boy then do?

What does this mean Jesus has power over?

Memory Verse: Philippians 2:9-10

"Wherefore God also hath highly exalted him, and given him a name which is above every name: That at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, on things in heaven, and things in earth, and the things under the earth;"

Bonus Memory Verse: Philippians 2:11

Thursday: The Authority of Jesus Christ

Bible Scholar Study

Here are a few more examples where Christ exercised his authority.

Read: Mark 4:35-41

Jesus slept in the boat while there was a storm going on. Why do you think he was able to do this?

Jesus only had to speak and the weather was calm. How did Jesus have that kind of authority?

What did the disciples think after Jesus had done this?

Read: Mark 1:21-28

What was different about the way Jesus taught?

A man with an unclean spirit cried out. What did Jesus tell the unclean spirit to do?

Does Jesus have authority even over spirits?
