Monday: Saul Disobeys God's Command

Devotions: We are reading in the book of I Samuel. This book was written around 1100 years before Christ. Remember that Saul was the first King of Israel after the time of the judges.

Read: I Samuel 15:1-34

1. Why did God command Saul to destroy Amalek?
2. How much of the Amalekite nation did Samuel tell king Saul to destroy?
3. What did Saul do that was against the command of God?
4. Was Saul sorry for what He had done?
5. What did Samuel tell Saul would be the consequences of His disobedience?

Friday: The Work of Christ

Devotions: Jesus came to this world because he loves you, and wants to be with you forever. Because He loves you so much, he came down to this world and died to pay for your sins, He then rose back to life, and He wants us to trust Him.

Read: Luke 23:13-25

Monday: David is Anointed

Read: I Samuel 16:1-23

1. What did God send Samuel to do?
2. Why was Samuel afraid?
3. Whose house did Samuel go to?
4. Who did God tell Samuel to anoint?
5. What position did David get appointed to under Saul?

“wherewithal shall a young man cleanse his way? By taking heed thereto according to thy word”

Bonus Memory Verse:

Tuesday: David fights Goliath

Devotions: Today we read about one of David's most famous exploits. Notice who David relied on and how brave he was in the face of so difficult a challenge.

Read: I Samuel 17:1-30

1. Who came up to fight against the Israelites?
2. What was Saul's and the men of Israel's reaction to Goliath's challenge?
3. What city was David from?
4. Was David originally in the army?
5. What was David's oldest brother's response to David's questions about Goliath?

4. How would you describe the victory that David and his men had over the Amalekites?

5. What type of men were they who wanted to keep the recovered spoil from those who had been to exhausted to follow?

5. What did David do for the men who were to exhausted to follow?

Saturday: David pursues the Amalekites

Devotions: This story is one of my favorites because it shows David demonstrating all the qualities I love most in him. David relies on the Lord, takes action, and is a valiant leader.

Bonus Reading: I Samuel 30:1-31

1. What were the people thinking about doing to David after all their families and possessions had been taken?
2. What did David do with the Ephod from the priest?
3. How many men did David have to leave behind?

Tuesday: David fights Goliath

Read: I Samuel 17:31-58

1. Why did Saul initially say that David would not be able to fight with Goliath?
2. Who did David say enabled him to kill the lion and the bear?
3. Why did David not wear Saul's armor.
4. In whose name did David fight Goliath?

Memory Verse:

Palms 147:5

“Great is our Lord, and abundant in strength; His understanding is infinite.”

Bonus Memory Verse:

Wednesday: Saul Becomes Envious of David

Devotions: Envy or covetousness can be very destructive. Pay attention to all the terrible things Saul is willing to do because he is envious of David.

Read: I Samuel 18:1-30

1. What do you think Jonathan saw in David that he loved so much?
2. What caused Saul to start hating David?
3. Why was Saul afraid of David?
4. Why was David prospering?
5. Why did Saul try to give David his daughters to be his wife?

Friday: David meets Abigail

Bonus Reading: I Samuel 25:1-44
(this reading is not required, but is worth 200 points)

1. What didn't Nabal consider in his response to David's men?
2. Why were Abigail's actions so wise?

Friday: David Spares Saul

Devotions: David knew that Samuel had anointed Him to be the next King of Israel, but He also knew that Saul had been anointed King. David refused to do harm to one anointed by God.

Read: I Samuel 24:1-22

1. How many men did Saul take to hunt David?
2. Where were David and his men hiding?
3. Saul was trying to find David and kill him. Why did David not kill Saul when he had the chance?
4. Saul makes peace with David, but do you think his change of heart is permanent?

Wednesday: Saul Seeks to Kill David

Read: I Samuel 19:1-24

1. What happened just before Saul tried to pin David to the wall with a spear?
2. After David fled from Saul, who did he go to?
3. What happened to Saul and his messengers when they came before Samuel?

Memory Verse:

Matthew 23:12

“And whosoever shall exalt himself shall be abased; and he that shall humble himself shall be exalted.”

Bonus Memory Verse:

Psalm 51:5

“Behold, I was shapen in iniquity; and in sin did my mother conceive me”

Thursday: Jonathan and David

Devotions: The friendship of Jonathan and David is one of the most impressive in scripture. Jonathan recognized David as chosen by God and chooses to support him even to his own loss.

Read: I Samuel 20:1-42

1. David ask Johnathan “what is my sin before your father?” what is the answer to this question?
2. How did Jonathan plan to see if his father was still angry with David? What was Jonathan looking for in Saul.
3. Jonathan is a prince but asks David not to harm his family when David becomes king. What does this say about Jonathan’s character?

4. What was Saul’s response when Jonathan defended David?
