## Draw Your Testimony

### Jesus the Messiah

This year we are studying Jesus' role as Messiah. If you don't know what that means, it's okay. Hopefully by the end of the week you will. Did you know that the Old Testament talked about Jesus hundreds and even thousands of years before He was born?

God's people, the Israelites, were looking for the Messiah, the man the Old Testament says will save Israel from their sins. At the time of Jesus' birth, Israel was being controlled by the Roman Empire. The popular idea was that the Messiah would be a military leader and lead Israel to defeat the Roman army thereby freeing Israel.

But God had a different plan...

This is your chance to be artistic in telling how you met Jesus Christ or simply what God means to you. A testimony is simply our story of how we became a believer in Jesus. Usually, we talk about 1) our life before we met Jesus 2) how we met Jesus and 3) how our life has changed since we met Jesus. But feel free to draw whatever you would like. **Helpful hints:** Use colors to express good /bad or feelings. (*Example:* red could represent *mad* and green could mean *happy*. Draw symbols to represent certain concepts. *Example:* a chain might represent *bondage* or water could mean *clean*. Use words if you want. Be creative and have fun!

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## Monday

**Devotion Starter:** The Old Testament (hereafter abbreviated "OT") is made up of 39 books written over hundreds of years. Hebrew is the main language of the Old Testament. All throughout the OT there are hints and sometimes explicit statements about the "one to come"- "The Anointed One"- or in Hebrew the *Messiah*. The Greek word for Messiah is *Christ*.

**Read Genesis chapters 2 and 3.**

1) In the beginning, after God created the world, was it good or bad?

2) When and why did it turn bad?

3) Because Adam and Eve disobeyed God, He had to punish them. What was their punishment?

4) What was the serpent's punishment?

5) Read Gen. 3:15 closely. God says that one day, a son of Eve will do what? And that a son of the serpent will do what? Scholars believe this is the first prediction in the OT of the "son that will come."

6) When God forced Adam and Eve out of the Garden, He made clothes from animal skins for them. Why is this important?

## More Bible Trivia

### Monday -Digging Deeper

When we study about the Messiah in the Old Testament, we are actually studying prophecy. What is prophecy? *A prophecy is a statement that God tells someone to say, usually about the future.*

Genesis carries out the theme of the "seed" or the "offspring." Specifically, it refers to the male lineage through whom a male heir will come to fulfill these prophecies and promises. Here are some verses that deal with the male heir to come.

**Read Genesis 12:1-9 and 13:1-15.**

What does God promise to Abraham in each of these passages?

In Gen 12:7 and 13:15, the word "seed" or "offspring" in the original Hebrew is *singular* in form. Why is this important?

**Read Gen 49:10.** In this chapter Jacob is blessing his sons. He tells Judah that the scepter and ruler's staff will not depart from him until one comes "to whom it belongs." What does this mean and why is it significant? (Hint: a scepter is a *king's* staff.)

## Tuesday—Digging Deeper

**Read Matthew 27:11-66.** What are the parallels between this passage and Psalm 22?

**Read Psalm 16:10.** What does it mean for God to "not abandon me to the grave nor will you let your Holy One see decay?"

*Many scholars believe this to be a prophecy of the Resurrection of the Messiah. "Not abandon to the grave" means he will not be left there and "not see decay" means his body will not rot or see corruption.*

**Read Lk 24:1-8.** Was Jesus "abandoned in the grave?"  
Did His body see decay?

Now that Jesus has conquered death, can He die anymore?

He now lives eternally as the King of Kings and Lord of Lords. His kingdom is eternal and His throne is established forever, just like God promised in 2 Samuel 7 to David.

## Tuesday Memory Verses

**Memory verse:** 1 John 5:1-2 "Everyone who believes that Jesus is the Christ is born of God, and everyone who loves the father loves his child as well. 2 This is how we know that we love the children of God: by loving God and carrying out his commands."

**Bonus verse:** Matthew 16:13-16 "When Jesus came into the region of Caesarea Philippi, He asked His disciples, saying, "Who do men say that I, the Son of Man, am?" **14** So they said, "Some say John the Baptist, some Elijah, and others Jeremiah or one of the prophets." **15** He said to them, "But who do you say that I am?" **16** Simon Peter answered and said, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God."

**Read Matthew 5:1-7:29.** This passage is known as the Sermon on the Mount.

Memorize this passage and you are well on your way to becoming a true Human Bible!

Psalm 119:9 and 11 says, "How can a young man (or lady) keep his way pure? By living according to your word...I have hidden your word in my heart that I might not sin against you."

## Wednesday- Continued

Look at 53:9 and then read Luke 23:32-33 and Matthew 27:57-60. *This is a prime example of prophecy fulfillment.*

Read Zechariah 12:10. In this passage God is telling of the salvation to come. What is God going to pour out on the people of Jerusalem?

God says He will be pierced. How would this be possible?

Read Lk 22:39 thru 24:1-12. You can easily see that Jesus is the "suffering servant" that Isaiah is talking about.

## Wednesday- Digging Deeper

Jesus sometimes refers to himself as the "Son of Man."

Read Daniel 7:13-14 and then read Luke 22:66-71.

1) According to Daniel, how long will the Son of Man's dominion and kingdom last?

2) God is a jealous God. This means He carefully guards what is His. (It does *not* mean that He wants other people's stuff. This is called *envy* or coveting and is sin.) God does not give His glory to another. What does this say about the Son of Man in the Daniel passage? Who is the Son of Man?

3) What is Jesus doing and saying about himself when He calls himself the Son of Man in the Luke passage?

## Wednesday Memory Verses

### Memory Verse:

**Isaiah 53:6** "All we like sheep have gone astray; We have turned, every one, to his own way; And the Lord has laid on Him the iniquity of us all."

### Bonus memory verses:

**2 Corinthians 5:20-21** "Now then, we are ambassadors for Christ, as though God were pleading through us: we implore you on Christ's behalf, be reconciled to God. **21** For He made Him who knew no sin to be sin for us, that we might become the righteousness of God in Him."

### Bible Scholar verses:

Isaiah 53:3-12 (look up in your own Bible)

### Human Bible verses:

Isaiah 52:13- 53:12 (look up in your own Bible)

## Friday-continued

- 4) How does Jesus say to worship the Father (vs 24)?
- 5) What was the woman's reaction to Jesus telling her that he was the Messiah (the Christ)?
- 6) What does Jesus say is his food?
- 7) What was the result of the woman telling everybody about Jesus?
- 8) What would happen if we all told people about Jesus?

### Digging Deeper

The result of one woman telling people about her encounter with Jesus was an entire village believing in Jesus. God wants us to tell our family, friends, and even those we don't know about Jesus, so that they may believe in Him too.

**Read Matthew 28:16-20.** What is the command of Jesus?

What is the reason we are to make disciples, baptize, and teach? (Hint: "therefore")

Revelation 4:11 and 5:9-10 show the same reasons we should go tell the world of the Savior- Jesus Christ.

## Friday

**Devotion starter:** In 722 B.C. God sent the Assyrians to invade the northern kingdom of Israel because they had worshiped other gods (see 2 Kings 17:6-41). Samaria was the capital of the northern kingdom of Israel. Some of the Israelites were captured and taken into Assyria while some Assyrians settled into Israel. The Assyrians brought with them their pagan gods. The remaining Israelites began to worship them. After God sent lions among the people, the king of Assyria sent one of the captured priests back to Israel to teach them to fear the Lord. The end result was that people worshiped both the Lord *and* pagan gods, producing a detestable blended religion and people group. Those who lived in the southern kingdom of Judah, where Jerusalem is the capital, began to dislike those who lived in Samaria. Samaritans were not respected and did not socialize with the Jews who lived in the south.

**Read John 4:1-45.**

- 1) Why was the woman surprised that Jesus would speak to her?
- 2) Look at verses 4:10-15. Was Jesus talking about real water or something else?
- 3) Why do you think Jesus told the woman to go call her husband when he already knew her whole background?

## Thursday

**Devotion Starter:** We tend to only think about the birth of Jesus at Christmas time. There is a lot more going on with the birth of Jesus than we sometimes realize. Hundreds of years before Jesus was born, the Prophets foretold the location and manner in which He was to be born. Jesus' birth literally altered the way we count time. The years before Jesus' birth are called "B.C." or "*Before Christ.*" The years after Jesus' birth are known as "A.D." or "*Anno Domini*" which is Latin for "In the year of our Lord," referring to the year that Jesus our Lord was born.

**Read Matthew 1:18- 2:23.**

- 1) Which prophet was Matthew quoting in Mt 1:23?
- 2) What does the name Immanuel mean?
- 3) How many wise men or "Magi" were there? (Read carefully!)
- 4) Which prophet is quoted by Matthew in 2:6?
- 5) How old was Jesus when the wise men came to offer their gifts? (Read VERY carefully!) [Hint: verse 2:16]
- 6) Do you really think Herod wanted to worship the child king? Why or why not?
- 7) Scan through Matthew chapters 1-4. Count how many times Matthew mentions fulfillment of an Old Testament prophecy. (Most Bibles quote the Old Testament using quote marks and/or will have a small italicized letter at the end of the OT reference to tell you where the quote is found in the OT.) What is the significance of quoting the OT so many times?

## Thursday- Digging Deeper

Read Micah 5:2.

- 1) The town of Bethlehem is located within the borders of which tribe of Israel?
- 2) Who will come out of Bethlehem?
- 3) From where will be his origins or beginnings?
- 4) Depending on which translation you read, the last part of that verse will read "ancient times," "everlasting," or "from days of eternity." What does having eternal origins say about the ruler that will be born in Bethlehem?

Read Isaiah 7:14. This was fulfilled in Matthew 1:22-23.

Read Isaiah 9:6-7.

- 5) What are the four names this future son will be called?
- 6) On whose throne and lineage will he come and how long will his rule be?

*\*It is of utmost importance to point out that 7:14 and 9:6 clearly says this male child to be born will be God Himself, taking the form of human flesh. Read John 1 for more on this.*

## Thursday Memory Verses

**Hebrews 11:1** "Now faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen."

Bonus verses:

**Isaiah 7:14** "Therefore the Lord Himself will give you a sign: Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a Son, and shall call His name Immanuel."
